

Welcome to the Park

Established in 1956 with 47 hectares, Lac Le Jeune Provincial Park has a campground, a lakeside picnic area and trails. A 1996 addition of 166 lakeside hectares will be maintained in its natural state.

Lac Le Jeune appeals to campers and anglers seeking an easily accessible and diverse assortment of year-round recreational activities. The waters of Lac Le Jeune lake are known for their “fighting rainbow trout” and great canoeing. Walk the lake trail to enjoy the variety of plants and wildlife in the area.

Gas, propane, and food may be found at the nearby communities of Kamloops, Merritt or Logan Lake.



Things to Do



The day-use is a large grassy area near the lake with 34 picnic tables and a picnic shelter.



The **Gus Johnson Trail** circles the lake through forest and skirting wet meadows. It is approximately 8 km in length. From the park there is access to the Gus Johnson trail and the extensive Stake Lake Trail (45 km of trail) system. Both trails are used for hiking, biking and cross-country skiing.



There is 146 m of sandy beach with a sectioned off swimming area.



Canoeing/kayaking is a popular activity.



Famous for rainbow trout fish (average 1.5 kg). A 250 ft fishing wharf located in day-use area. An appropriate licence is required.

Visitor Services



Vehicle accessible treed campsites and 21 double sites. Most sites accommodate medium to large size RVs.



Adventure playground and horseshoe pitches located near the centre of the campground.



Visitors can use sani-station for a fee.



Fishing wharf, washrooms and hiking trails are accessible.



There is a concrete car ramp for boats. Maximum speed is 20 km/h on the lake.



At campsite #6; available for questions about facilities, services and recreation opportunities in the parks.

Enjoy Your Stay

Park regulations protect the natural state of the park and ensure a quality experience for all visitors.

- Fires are permitted in designated fire rings only and may not exceed 1/2m in height. Do not leave unattended as this is a high risk forest fire area. Visitors may bring firewood or purchase at park.
- Pets must be on a leash at all times but are permitted in day-use and beach areas specified for pets. Please be responsible for their behaviour and waste.
- Liquor consumption is allowed in campsites only.
- Generator use is only permitted between the hours of 9am – 11am, and from 6pm – 8pm.
- Quiet time is between 10pm and 7am.
- To preserve vegetation, do not gather firewood or marshmallow/weiner sticks within the park.
